






## Children's Speech and Language Therapy Syllable Sorting Game

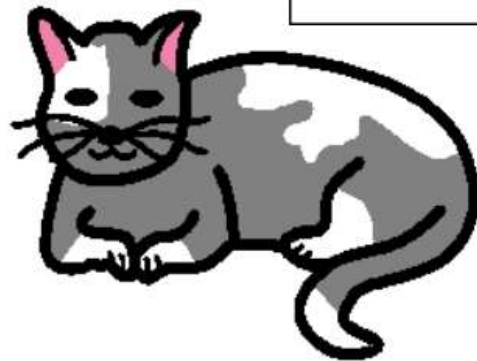
Syllables are the number of beats in words. They help us learn the difference between long and short words. They also help us to hear all the sounds in a word.

As well as clapping out the words, you can use stampers, tapping or beating the words.

### How to play

- Cut out the pictures.
- Turn them face down.  
- Take it in turns to pick up a picture and clap or stamp the number of syllables the word has. For example **ba-na-na**.
- Say the word when you clap or stamp.   
- See if your child can count/recognise how many syllables the word has (how many claps/stomps they have done). Put the picture on the board with the right number of syllables.
- For example **ba-na-na** would go on the board with 3 on the front (elephant). Instead of using the boards you can use post boxes, buckets, boxes or crisp tubes with the numbers on the front.
- If your child finds it hard you can clap or stamp the words while they count or vice versa. You can work together.
